TRANSITION – What is it?

Transition Day at ASHS is where we give students from a primary school, or from several smaller primary schools, a structured day to explore both the Year 7 Egret Wing, as well as the wider school campus. Students spend time both in the Egret Wing classes with the Year 7 teachers as well as venturing out to exciting specialist classes including Performing Arts; Design, Technology and Enterprise; LOTE; and Health and Physical Education.

ORIENTATION – What is it?

Orientation Day at ASHS is a day where we have our full cohort of enrolled Year 6 students join us for a fun day of team building and getting to know each other. Students will meet the entire Year 7 team and their homeroom teacher, their key pastoral care figure as they start their journey at ASHS. Students will experience what it is like to shift for each class and follow a timetable and learn some tips, tricks and fabulous strategies to be on time and ready for class. Teachers will explain high school expectations, HOMEWORK (everyone's favourite) and some Maths Placement Testing.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND FAQs FOR TRANSITION AND ORIENTATION DAYS AT ASHS

What do students wear?

All Year 6 students must wear their full primary school uniform, including a hat and closed in shoes or sneakers.

What time do they need to be at ASHS?

8.30am on the front lawn...we will meet you there!

How do they get to ASHS?

Each week our Year 7 Student Leaders chooses a 'Virtue Of The Week' that the whole team focuses on. This is then celebrated at our weekly assembly with certificates awarded.
