# Charges and Voluntary Contributions 2023 Information

## Year 7 – 10 Contributions Structure

Voluntary contributions for Yr 7-10 are set at a maximum of \$235 which allows students to access our school courses. The school is requesting a payment of \$235 for each student towards the cost of materials, textbooks, photocopying materials used by students in the education program. Voluntary contributions are allocated to learning areas for all courses. All funds collected within the year are spent on resources for the year. Parent contributions assists our school to provide textbooks instead of students having to provide their own, purchase reading materials, curriculum resources, ICT, photocopying materials and other resources which support our educational program for your child. Australind Senior High School relies heavily on the payment of charges and voluntary contributions to enable quality courses to be run. Declining payment of voluntary contributions places a large burden on the school community. The continuing partnership between schools and parents is vital to ensuring that all students receive quality practices within the subject learning areas.

## Year 7 - 10 Elective Charges Structure

The elective courses have an additional compulsory charge associated with them. Low-cost option courses are also available for students. Payment in full for all compulsory charges must be paid by **6 April 2023**.

## Year 11 & 12 Charges Structure

All course charges in Year 11 and 12 have compulsory charges associated with them. Payment of these charges is compulsory. The courses are high cost and enrichment items associated with each particular course. Compulsory charges are required to be paid prior to the end of Term 1 unless payment arrangements have been made with the office. The school offers payment plans so assist parents in meeting their commitments. Payment in full for all compulsory charges must be paid by **6 April 2023**.

The services of a debt collection agency are used for all unpaid charges and unpaid charges will be referred to the agency on **5 May 2023**. To ensure your account is not referred to this agency, please contact our administration team prior to the end of Term 1. We appreciate that the payment of the Contributions and Charges can be expensive, should you be experiencing difficulties with making these payments please contact our administration team on 9797 4400. Direct Debit is a service that the school operates with no charges to the parent. Payments (minimum \$10) can be deducted from your nominated bank account on a weekly, fortnightly or monthly basis.

### CENTRELINK CENTREPAY

Centrepay is a free and voluntary service to pay expenses as regular deductions from parents receiving Centrelink payments. Payments can be deducted from your nominated Centrelink payment on a fortnightly basis.

The Parent/Guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. (1 February 2023 – 6 April 2023). Students must be listed on claimant's card (except for some Year 11 and 12 students, or in cases of disability/health reasons). In these instances, the School must sight both concession cards. The only exception to this is when a student holds their own health care card and has been declared Independent by Centrelink (e.g. living away from home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation or statement from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age i.e. students born in 2004 or before are ineligible in 2023.

### ABSTUDY

The ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance is available to valid Services Australia (Centrelink) card holders, this funding supplements the Centrelink ABSTUDY Fees Allowance payment.

The school or parent must have received the School Fee Allowance of \$78 or \$156 from the Centrelink as part of the student's ABSTUDY School Fees Allowance.

The Department of Education ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance consists of \$79 Education Program Allowance paid directly to the school.

**Please note that the Secondary Assistance Scheme cannot be claimed as well as the Abstudy Allowance.**

## **BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) Program Financial Support Information**

Australind Senior High School (ASHS) has moved to a BYOD arrangement for all students Year 7 – 12. At ASHS we have a view that students and staff should be able to bring a device onsite and have access to our friendly BYOD learning environment. The School now has greater bandwidth capacity, and this will enable devices to work effectively on our School's wireless system. This program means that students will be strongly encouraged to bring an approved electronic device to School so that they can undertake a range of educational activities. Students are gaining new skills necessary for their future workplaces and careers and finding this aspect to be very engaging.

Parents and students are reminded that all personal devices always remain the responsibility of the student and the School does not take any liability for loss or damage. There is no school Insurance available to cover this so personal arrangements would need to be made to protect devices i.e., through Home and Contents Insurance.

Students have free access to Office 365 from the Education Department for the duration of their time at School, via access with their school email address so there is no requirement for parents to purchase this software. With Office 365 they also receive 100gb storage with OneDrive. Students have access to school monitored wireless network, school files and work can be printed from any device via Papercut.

The School has partnered with the below suppliers to offer a device program to students. The devices with these companies meet our minimum specification requirements to best connect with our learning environment.

## Computer Network Charges

### Web Services

Internet access is provided by Department of Education free to all students. Students' internet activity is monitored by the School. Students visiting inappropriate sites, using proxy blocking sites or downloading excessive amounts will have their Internet access removed. Students are not to download music, videos or game files off the Departments Network.

### Printing

**Years 11-12** are charged a set rate of \$20 per year to cover the cost of printing. When all used, additional printing credit can be purchased through the School.

**Years 7-10** receive \$20 per year which comes from the School's General Grant. When all used, additional printing credit can be purchased through the School.

Student printing is monitored by the 'Paper Cut' software. Once used, students will be unable to print until such time as they pay a fee to bring their account into credit. The school charges 0.6 cents for A4 black and white and 15 cents for A4 colour.

Trans Bunbury requires students to have a Smart Rider Card which enables them to tag on and off the buses for a discounted fare.

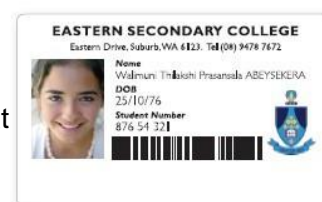
The School's Library has incorporated both Smart Rider and the School Library Cards, with the cost being **\$3.00**, you can also purchase a protector cover for **\$3.00**.

The card is valid for five years, if they are lost/broken etc., a replacement card can be ordered for **\$3.00**.

When arriving late to school, students can also use their Smart Rider card at the Attendance window to speed up the sign in process. This is done by tapping the student's Smart Rider card on the Compass Kiosk located at the Attendance window.

## Health Centre

The Australind Senior High School's Health Centre is staffed four days per week by a Registered Community Health Nurse and is available on 9797 4400.

Students are encouraged to take responsibility for their own health and wellbeing. They can access first aid supplies which are available to treat minor injuries the same as they would at home. Any serious concerns will be treated by the Nurse or a trained First Aid Officer in the Nurse's absence.

### **Services tailored for students at Australind Senior High School include:**

- Health assessments and the provision of health information and education.
- Support, advice and external referrals.
- The support provided encourages the development of knowledge, skills and behaviour and encourages young people to cope with their health concerns and make healthy lifestyle choices.

### **Students can seek information, guidance and support about a range of issues that may include:**

- Stress and anxiety
- Mental health
- Issues related to family relationships
- Social relationships
- Healthy lifestyles
- Sexual health
- Smoking, alcohol, drug use
- Culture, racism and bullying issues
- Loss and grief
- And other adolescent health concerns

Resources and medical supplies are required to assist in promoting Health and Wellbeing in our School. Promotional tools, books and educational materials as well as first aid supplies eg band aids, dressing, bandages, personal hygiene supplies, are required to allow the quality care provided to continue. The School encourages families to contribute to the voluntary levy of **\$5.00** towards sustaining these ongoing resources which show on your Charges and Voluntary Contributions Sheet.

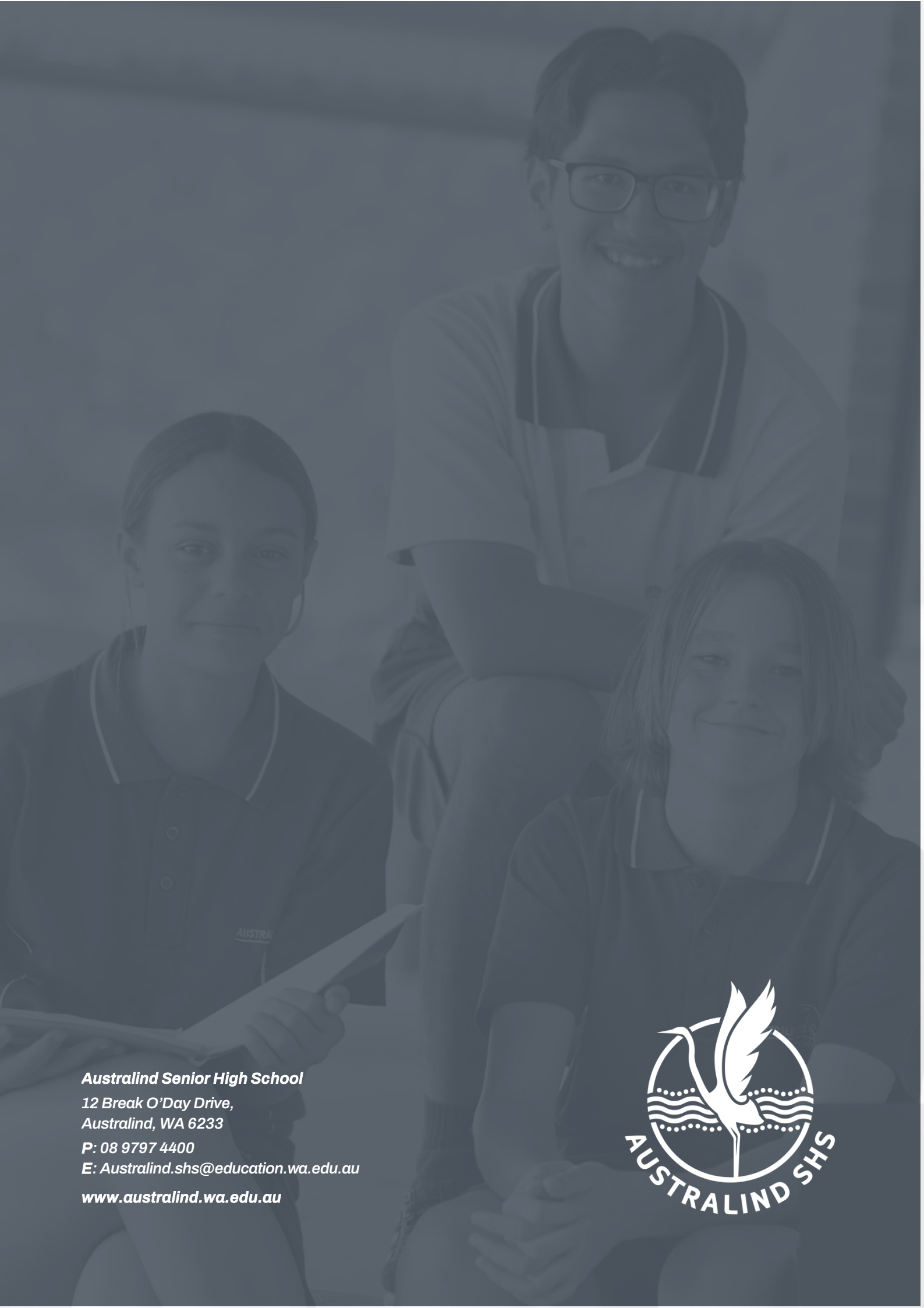
